
Sex

	There is a pill you can take every day.

	You can use condoms, which go on a penis.

For penis For vagina	which can go inside a vagina.	
Emergency Contraception		
	There is a pill that you can take soon after sex to stop you getting pregnant. You can get this from pharmacies, GPs and sexual health clinics.	
	You can also have a "coil" fitted after having sex, to stop you getting pregnant. This is done at a sexual health clinic or GP.	



Sexual Health Clinics

A sexual health clinic has doctors and nurses who can help you with things to do with sex.
They can give you contraception, which stops you getting pregnant.
They can test for infections.
They can give you medicine to get rid of infections, or to make you feel better.
You can talk to them about problems with your penis or vagina.
